The Grand Site de France label is granted by the minister of Environment. It is recorded in the French Environmental Code and is awarded for a duration of 8 years renewable. The label distinguishes management of a landscape that guarantees its long-term protection.

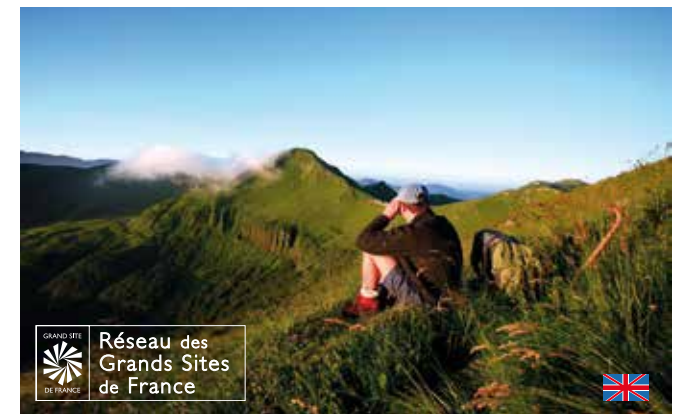

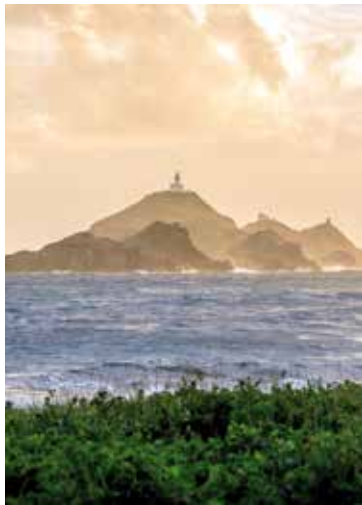

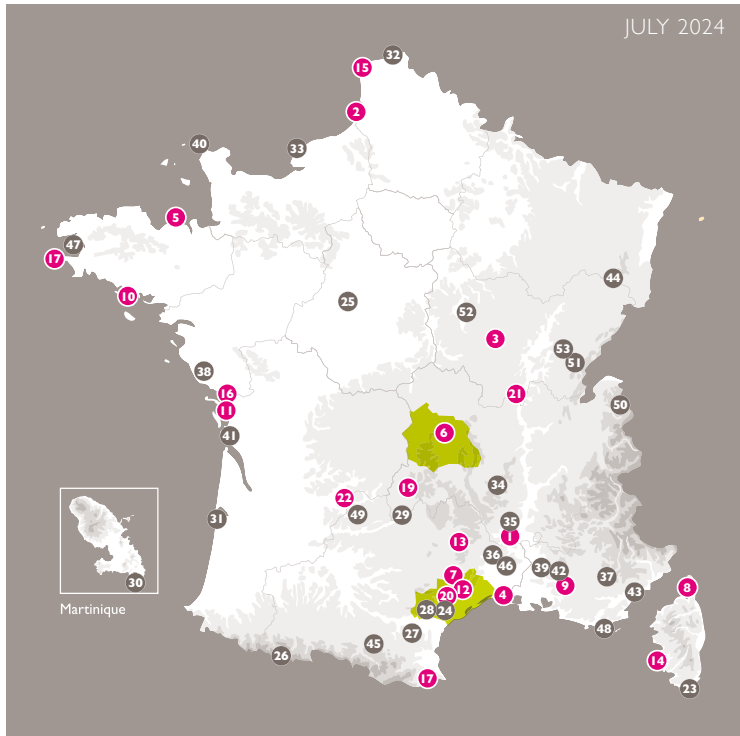
